some confidence and experience that I hope will propel our teams to the next level."

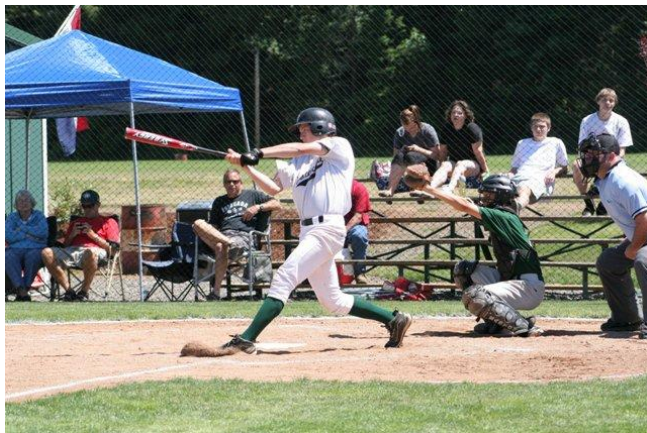

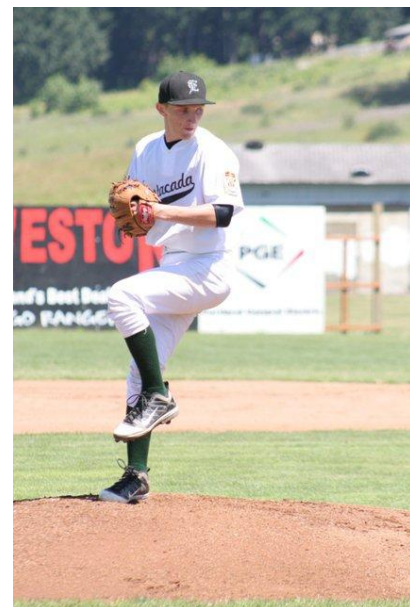

a designated hitter. Layton had 3 hits in 7 at bats as the North was defeated by the south 2 games to 1.

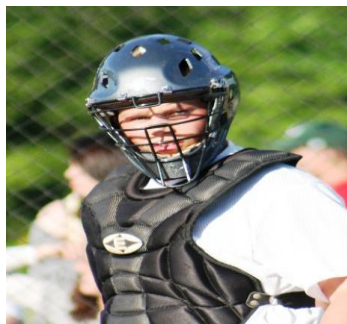
Layton will attend Mt. Hood Community College to play baseball this season.
